Case is taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

This petition has been filed for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioner in case bearing FIR No.167 dated 16.06.2021 registered under Sections 120-B, 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC at Police Station Sector 13/17, District Panipat.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been involved in the present case. The petitioner is dealing with the sale and purchase of the cars and has nothing to do with the offences as alleged in the FIR. There was no proof that the amount of Rs.10,10,000/- was given to petitioner by co-accused Lalit and Vinay. Rather, on 09.03.2021, the petitioner purchased a Creta car from one Joginder, who had assured the petitioner that he would furnish all the documents relating to the ownership of the vehicle and had taken an amount of Rs.9,70,000/- from the petitioner.

Learned State counsel submits that as per the allegations the petitioner had prepared the fake documents and he was involved in

changing the engine and chassis numbers of the vehicles for sale. Moreover, the recovery of Rs.9,10,000/- is yet to be effected from the petitioner.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

As per the prosecution version, the petitioner in connivance with the co-accused is alleged to have sold the Creta car to the complainant while knowing that the registration number as well as registration certificate and other accompanying documents of the vehicle were fake and forged. The allegations against the petitioner are serious in nature. The custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required for the purpose of recovery of Rs.9,10,000/-. The gangs involved in sale and purchase of the vehicles after changing the engine and chassis numbers and preparing fake documents, are operating in different parts in the State of Haryana.

In view of the above, the petitioner is not entitled to the concession of bail.

Dismissed.
