Case taken up through video conferencing.

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.201 dated 24.05.2021, under Sections 306, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station City Rewari, District Rewari.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it was mentioned in the suicide note which was addressed by the deceased to his mother that he had to take a sum of ₹2,00,000/- from the petitioner and had asked his mother to recover the same and give it to his father. In the latter part of the suicide note, the petitioner and one Chandan are being blamed for the suicide. The deceased had thanked other persons and his friends who had helped him in online gambling. The deceased had also lost money in gambling. He also contends that the petitioner is not involved in any other criminal case. He also contends that the petitioner has paid a sum of ₹2,00,000/- through demand draft to the complainant without prejudice to his rights and

Contentions.

This Court, by the order dated 04.08.2021, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Sanjay Kumar, states that although the petitioner has joined investigation but he is not cooperating.

In view of the above and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 04.08.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
