Prayer in this application is for placing on record the impugned order as also the zimni orders passed by the Consolidation Officer as Annexures P-4 and P-5.

Prayer made in the application is accepted. Documents, Annexures P-4 and P-5 abovesaid are taken on record subject to just exceptions.

CWP-13825-2021

Having considered the submissions made by counsel for the petitioners and on going through the impugned order dated 27.01.2021

(Annexure P-4), we do not find any ground for interfering in the said order for simple reason that the basic assertion on the part of the petitioners was that they had not been served in the proceedings, which were initiated before the Director, Land Records, Punjab, in a petition under Section 42 of the East Punjab Holdings (Consolidation and Prevention of Fragmentation) Act, 1948 by the private respondents. However, the zimni orders, which have been placed on record, clearly indicate that after the service having been effected upon the petitioners, they had put in appearance before the Director, Land Records, Punjab, on 26.09.2018. Thereafter, they absented themselves before the said authority on 14.10.2020. On 13.01.2021, which was the date fixed for consideration, the petitioners were proceeded against exparte and the case was adjourned to 27.01.2021, on which date, after considering the records and the pleadings, the prayer of the private respondents has been accepted. The impugned order clearly indicates that there has been no passage provided to the private respondents, which has been so done after going through the records vide the impugned order. Thus, no ground is made out for interfering in the well reasoned and justified order passed by the Director, Land Records, Punjab.

The writ petition, therefore, stands dismissed.
