Prayer in the instant petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, *inter alia*, is for issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to grant appointment to the petitioner on the post of SS Mistress under B.C. Ex Serviceman (Dependent) category on account of possessing higher merit marks 97 than the last selected General Ex Serviceman (Dependent) Category-respondent No.4, who has secured only 68 marks and to consider and grant her appointment on the post of S.S. Mistress under open Ex Serviceman (Dependent) category with all consequential benefits as given to the person lower in merit.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, on instructions, states that at this stage, his client would be satisfied in case, legal notice dated 01.06.2021 (P-11) is considered and decided by passing a speaking order expeditiously.

Prayer seems to be justified.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Ms. Akshita Chauhan, AAG, Punjab, who is present through video-conference, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent Nos.1 to 3. Learned State counsel raises no objection against the innocuous prayer made on behalf of the petitioner.

In view of the agreed stand taken by both sides, but without going into the merits of the controversy, this writ petition is disposed off with direction to respondent No.2, to consider and decide the aforesaid legal notice dated 01.06.2021 (P-11), in accordance with law by passing speaking order, within a period of four months.
