Case is taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

This is a petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 56 dated 15.08.2020 under Sections 353, 186, 188, 269, 270, 506, 34 IPC, Section 3 of Epidemic Act, 1897 and Section 51 of Disaster Management Act, 2005, registered at PS Thulliwal, Barnala.

On 04.09.2020, this Court passed the following order :-

“Case is being taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

This is a petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 56 dated 15.08.2020 under Sections 353, 186, 188, 269, 270, 506, 34 IPC, Section 3 of Epidemic Act, 1897 and Section 51 of Disaster Management Act, 2005, registered at PS Thulliwal, Barnala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the main allegations are against Darshan Singh-father of the petitioner, who was Corona positive and no threats or abuses were given to the health team which visited his village.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of this Court, Mr. Ajay Pal Singh Gill, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State and states that the health team came all the way to take Darshan Singh who was Corona positive but instead of opening the door, both the accused i.e. the petitioner and his father Darshan Singh started abusing the health team.

In the present case, the allegations against the petitioner are that he along with his father Darshan Singh, abused the health team but admittedly, it is a case of no injury.

Adjourned to 11.01.2021.

Meanwhile, petitioner is directed to join the investigation and if he is sought to be arrested, he shall be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer with the condition of furnishing surety bonds of Rs. 2 lakhs with the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer. He shall also abide by the conditions as envisaged in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure. ”.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to the order dated 04.09.2020 passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Manjeet Singh, states that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is not required for any further investigation.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the above, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 04.09.2020 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
