This petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C for grant of regular bail has been moved by petitioner-**Ayyub** in case FIR No.162 dated 03.09.2020 under Sections 3/13(1) and 8/13(3) of The Haryana Gauvansh Sanrakshan and Gausamvardhan Act, 2015 and Section 511 IPC, registered at Police Station Bicchor, District Nuh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner *inter alia* contends that version, as alleged in the FIR, is totally false, frivolous and concocted one and there is no iota of truth therein. He further submits that allegedly petitioner has been shown to be involved in slaughtering of cows, whereas petitioner has no nexus whatsoever with the alleged offence. He further urges that petitioner is languishing in custody since 24.04.2021 and he is no more required by the Investigating Agency for any investigation purpose as after completion of investigation, final report as envisaged under Section 173 Cr.P.C. (*Challan*) has already been presented in Court. He further submits that since trial of the case would take sufficient time to

conclude, no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner in custody further and he may be released on bail.

On the other hand, learned State counsel while opposing instant petition has vehemently argued that keeping in view seriousness of offence, petitioner does not deserve the concession of bail.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and carefully gone through the record of the case.

At this stage, without commenting anything on the merits of the case lest it may prejudice the outcome of the trial but taking into consideration the fact that petitioner is languishing in custody since 24.04.2021; that petitioner is no more required by the Investigating Agency for investigation purpose as after completion of investigation final report as envisaged under Section 173 Cr.P.C. (*Challan*) has already been presented in Court and since trial of the case would take sufficient time to conclude, no useful purpose would be served by detaining the petitioner in custody further, thus, he deserves the concession of bail.

In view of above, instant petition for grant of regular bail moved by petitioner-**Ayyub** is allowed and he is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing personal bond surety bond to the satisfaction of Trial Court/Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, Mewat at Nuh, as the case may be.
