GIRISH AGNIHOTRI, J. (Oral)

Petitioner-Lakhbir Singh, has filed the present petition *inter alia* with a prayer for directing the respondents to reinstate the petitioner back in service with full service benefits.

Records of the case show that this Court on 05.09.2011, had issued notice of motion and on 26.02.2013, the main petition was admitted. During pendency of the writ petition, CM Nos.2943 & 2944 of 2020, had been filed by the applicant-petitioner *inter alia* with the prayers to seek exemption and for early hearing of the main case, respectively.

For the order that is proposed to be passed by this Court, no further orders are called for in the present applications and the same are

disposed of as such.

CM-12741-2020 has been filed by the applicant-petitioner *inter alia* with the prayer to list CM-2943-44 of 2020 for some actual date.

In para 4 of this application, it has been pleaded that based on the representation given by the petitioner for his reinstatement into the services, the Execution Committee on 29.07.2012, appointed the petitioner as Sewadar at Gurdwara Shri Manji Sahib, Ambala. He however submits that he has not been paid salary of certain periods.

The respondents are directed to examine the representation (which the petitioner may submit within two weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order) and pass an appropriate order on the same as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of two months from the receipt of the representation.

Accordingly, CM-12741-2020 stands disposed of.

CM-8190-2021 has been filed by the applicant-petitioner *inter alia* with a prayer to withdraw the main writ petition.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, by making reference to the pleadings in the petition, submits that during pendency of the writ petition, a settlement has been arrived at between the parties.

Notice of the application.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Sukhbir Singh Mattewal, Advocate, puts in appearance on behalf of the respondents and also supports the fact that the issue has been settled out of the Court. The petitioner has been allowed to join on the post of Sewadar.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is allowed.

In view of the above facts and circumstances, the main writ petition is taken on board today itself i.e. 14.09.2021 and the same is dismissed as withdrawn. Subsequent applications, if any pending with the main petition, also stand disposed of accordingly.
