This petition has been filed under the provisions of Section 482 of the Cr.P.C. seeking the quashing of FIR No.25 dated 21.1.2020, registered at Police Station Maqboolpura (Annexure P-1); alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under the provisions of Sections 323, 325, 148 and 149 of the IPC; and of '*rapat*' No.41 dated 16.1.2020 (Annexure P-2), on the basis of which the FIR was registered, alongwith all

subsequent proceedings arising therefrom; on the basis of a compromise dated 03.2.2020.

Pursuant to the order of this Court dated 18.12.2020, the report of the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Amritsar, dated 12.1.2021, is on record, stating to the effect that the complainant in the FIR, i.e. respondent No.2-Kuldeep Singh, as also the injured Sukrajbir Singh @ Sukhmanbir Singh (respondent No.3), alongwith the petitioners, i.e. the accused, Satinder Singh, Harjeet Kaur, Maninder Singh @ Manjinder Singh and Jatinder Singh @ Satwinder Singh, appeared before that court on 12.1.2021 and suffered statements that they have compromised the matter with each other voluntarily and of their free will and have no objection if the FIR in question is quashed.

The identities of the parties were also established by that court as per the statements of their counsel; and as per the assessment of that court, the compromise arrived at between the parties was actually voluntary and of their free consent without any undue influence or pressure. It has also been stated in the report that none of them have ever been declared to be a proclaimed offender.

Today Mr. Kamal Narula, Advocate, appears for Mr. Sukhmeet Singh, Advocate for respondents No.2 and 3 (with the power of attorney of Mr. Sukhmeet Singh, Advocate, being on record), with him also reiterating the factum of the compromise arrived at between the parties.

That being so, also looking at the nature of offences 'involved', with the matter having been amicably settled between the parties, the petition is allowed and FIR No.25 dated 21.1.2020, under Sections 323,

325, 148, 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Maqboolpura, as also Rapat No.41 dated 16.1.2020 (Annexure P-2), along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, are hereby quashed.
