1. Prayer in the petition under Sections 10 and 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order dated 23.04.2010 in CWP No. 592 of 2010.

2. Learned counsel contends that the instant petition was filed on account of non-compliance with order dated 23.04.2010 in CWP No.592-2010 but now in compliance of the orders as referred to above, gratuity as per entitlement has been paid to the petitioner, therefore, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and the same may be disposed of as such.

3. Learned counsel for the respondent on the other hand contends that in view of order dated 23.04.2010 having been complied with and the payment of gratuity released to the petitioner as per his entitlement, no action under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is called for against the respondent.

4. I have considered the submissions of learned counsel for the

parties.

5. In view of order dated 23.04.2010 in CWP NO. 592-2010 having been complied with and payment of gratuity as per entitlement of the petitioner been released, no action under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is called for against the respondent.

6. Contempt petition is disposed of accordingly.
