Prayer in this petition is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.53 dated 20.03.2021, registered under Sections 379-B and 411 IPC, at Police Station Dirba, District Sangrur.

This is the second petition. The earlier petition was dismissed as withdrawn on 27.07.2021. The new ground for filing the present petition is that the matter has been compromised between the petitioner and the complainant.

Brief facts of the case are that the FIR was registered on the statement of Kuldeep Singh that he is working as a salesman at Reliance Petrol Pump. He alongwith one Manpreet Singh was present at the said petrol pump when two unknown persons came walking on the petrol pump and they were wearing face masks. They were carrying weapons and they asked for petrol as their car run out of petrol. He was informed that their car

is parked in the main road. They handed over Rs.100/- and asked to put petrol of Rs.70/- in a bottle. When the complainant was returning the balance amount of Rs.30/-, one of the person grabbed his bag which was carrying approximately Rs.10,000/- and ran away. Despite searching for him he was untraceable.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that now the complainant has given an affidavit that one of the accused Satnam Singh has died and he has no grudge against the petitioner and that the complainant has resolved the issue with Lakhdeep Singh (co-accused) and others.

Learned State counsel assisted by the counsel for the complainant has not disputed the fact that the matter has been compromised. Learned State counsel has further submitted that the petitioner is in custody for the last 03 months and 10 days and is not involved in any other case.

After hearing the learned counsel for the parties, without commenting upon the merits of the case and considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is directed to be released on regular bail on his furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate/Illaq Magistrate concerned.
