The present petition has been filed seeking grant of interim bail to the petitioner on medical reasons.

The learned counsel for the petitioner has referred to Annexure P-2 and also the report of the Medical Officer at page No. 17 of the paper-book to contend that the petitioner is suffering from Diabetes and therefore, he should be considered for grant of interim bail on this ground.

A perusal of the report of the Medical Officer shows that the petitioner is taking prescribed medicines and is stable and till then the petitioner is under observation and his RBS on 13.07.2021 was 146.

Mr. Randhir Singh Thind, learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab has stated that the petitioner cannot be granted interim bail merely on the ground that he is suffering from Diabetes and furthermore, as per the report of the Medical Officer his Diabetes is under control and rather the

Medical Officer on 13.07.2021 has stated that the petitioner will be referred to the Civil Hospital, Amritsar for HBA1C test and, therefore, no ground is made out for grant of interim bail.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

The prayer of the petitioner for grant of interim bail is based upon some medical reasons. However, the arguments raised by the learned counsel for the parties as well as the record shows that the petitioner may have been suffering only for Diabetes and that too is under control as per the report of the Medical officer dated 13.07.2021 which is at page No.17 of the paper-book. It has been further mentioned by the Medical Officer, Central Jail, Amritsar that the patient will be referred to Civil Hospital, Amritsar for HBA1C test and till then the patient is under observation and stable and RBS was done on 13.07.2021 and the reading of the same was 146.

In view of the above, this Court finds that no ground is made out for the grant of interim bail to the petitioner for medical reasons.

Consequently, the present petition is dismissed.
