ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 0288 dated 30.07.2021, under Sections 420, 467, 468 & 471 IPC, registered at Police Station Ambala City, District Ambala.

A coordinate Bench of this court, on 20.09.2021, had passed the following order:-

“Allegations against the petitioner are that he secured a job as Class IV employee in Allahabad Bank on the basis of forged 8th class Certificate.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner was appointed in the year 2010 and that the case is based on documentary evidence. The petitioner is ready and willing to cooperate with the investigation.

Adjourned to 29.11.2021.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim anticipatory bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions provided under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C. The petitioner is also directed to join the investigation and cooperate with the

Investigating Agency, as and when required.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the present FIR against the petitioner is a counter-blast to the FIR No.278 dated 26.11.2018, under Sections 148, 149, 323 and 325 IPC, registered at Police Station Ambala Sadar by the father of the petitioner against the father of the complainant. He also contends that the petitioner does not have any criminal antecedents.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from Inspector Ram Kumar, states that although the petitioner has joined investigation but he is not cooperating.

In view of the above, especially when the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 20.09.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.

Criminal miscellaneous applications also stand disposed of.
