1. This petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is filed seeking regular bail in FIR No. 18, dated 7th January, 2021, under Sections 193, 201, 205, 297, 420, 467, 468, 471, 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station Hansi City, Police District Hansi, District Hisar, Haryana.

2. The allegations against the petitioner in the FIR are that accused in connivance with each other were claiming insurance claims on the death of cancer patients by showing the cause of death as road side accident. The role attributed to the petitioner is that he had made a false statement under Section 175 Cr.P.C. qua death of Satyanaryan whose insurance claim was made.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is in custody since 13th July, 2021. He further submits that it is a case of false implication, petitioner was granted bail on 6th August, 2021 by this Court in the FIR having similar allegations.

4. Learned State counsel opposes the prayer for grant of regular bail and submits that the petitioner is involved in other FIRs. She further

submits that the challan stands presented.

5. The petitioner is in custody for more four months. No recovery is to be made. Considering the nature of allegations and gravity of offence alleged, petitioner is granted bail on furnishing surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned.
6. The petition is allowed.
7. It is clarified that the observations made hereinabove shall not be cosntrued as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
