SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioner, who is the accused person in F.I.R No.0062, dated 27.02.2019, under Sections 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station Women, District Ludhiana (Annexure P-1), has prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings pending therefrom, on the basis of compromise.

2. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, the complainant has arrived at a settlement with the accused person vide Compromise (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Ld. District and Sessions Judge, Ludhiana

vide report dated 07.12.2020 has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

3. Respondent No. 2 is represented by his counsel through Video Conferencing who does not dispute the factum of compromise.

4. In view of the report of the Ld. District and Sessions Judge, Ludhiana, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in “Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and “Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioner/accused person.

5. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R No.0062, dated 27.02.2019, under Sections 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station Women, District Ludhiana (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed *qua* the petitioner.
