Case taken up through video conferencing.

On 26.06.2019, a Coordinate Bench of this Court had passed the following order:-

“This is a petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.188 dated 05.06.2019 under Sections 420, 406 & 506 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Kundli, District Sonipat (Annexure P-1).

The allegations in the FIR are that the petitioner has duped the complainant and his relatives by taking an amount of ₹38 lacs on the promise of providing them coaching and getting a Government job.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the transactions are alleged to have taken place in Aligarh. He further states that pursuant to the interim orders of learned Additional Sessions Judge, Sonipat, the petitioner has already

joined the investigation. The prosecution is alleged to be in possession of 33 original receipts issued by the petitioner to various persons for providing coaching as also for securing jobs. The petitioner specifically denies that those original receipts bear his signatures. The petitioner has already given his signatures to the Investigating Officer to verify the authenticity of the original receipts.

Notice of motion for 31.07.2019.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner-Shiv Charan shall be released on interim anticipatory bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. The petitioner is also directed to join the investigation and cooperate with the Investigating Agency, as and when required.”

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from SI Naresh Kumar, states that the petitioner has joined investigation.

In view of the above and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 26.06.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
