The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 81 dated 18.06.2021, under Sections 324, 323, 506, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 ('IPC' - for short) (apprehension of adding offence under Section 326 IPC), registered at Police Station City Batala, District Batala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner had also been caused injury by the complainant 15 days prior to the registration of the FIR. The injury which has been attributed to the petitioner is on the non-vital part of the body of the complainant.

Heard.

This Court had dismissed the earlier petition for anticipatory bail bearing CRM-M No. 30218 of 2021 on 09.08.2021. The operative part of the order is reproduced hereunder:-

“The allegations against the petitioner are that he, who was armed with a datar, along with other co-accused had given

several blows to the complainant and his family members. It is alleged in the FIR that the petitioner used to harass the daughter of the complainant. The injury which is attributed to the petitioner was on the arm of the complainant with a datar and had resulted in a fracture.”

The petitioner is stated to have been beaten up by the complainant and his family members 15 days prior to the occurrence. This argument does not help the petitioner in any manner whatsoever as it could establish the motive on the part of the petitioner to take revenge. Even otherwise, having dismissed the previous petition for anticipatory bail, I do not find any good ground to take another view in the matter.

Consequently, the petition stands dismissed.
