This is a petition that has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.157, dated 20.12.2019, registered under Sections 419, 420, 467, 471, 120-B of IPC at Police Station Tapa Mandi, District Barnala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner herein would contend that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the said matter on the ground that the petitioner had received an amount of Rs.38 lakhs in cash from the complainant who is a police official alleging that the petitioner herein had promised to get a job for the son of the complainant. It is argued that the police official himself would not have the means to pay an amount of Rs.38 lakhs in cash. It is further argued that by an order dated 10.11.2020, the petitioner herein had been allowed interim bail subject to him depositing an

amount of Rs.5 lakhs, under protest, out of which, Rs.3 lakhs was deposited on 10.11.2020 and the balance amount of Rs.2 lakhs stands deposited on 11.01.2021.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State does not dispute the fact that the amounts stand deposited in terms of the aforesaid order.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have also perused the interim order passed in the instant petition. The petitioner was released on interim bail on his undertaking as noticed above. He has surrendered his passport in terms of the said order and has also fulfilled the terms of the undertaking.

Consequently, the interim order dated 10.11.2020 is made absolute. The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
