1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

2. At the outset, learned State Counsel states that order dated 20.11.2018 in CWP No.15057 of 2016 has been stayed by Hon'ble the Division Bench in LPA No.1976 of 2019, therefore, no further orders are called for and the contempt petition may be disposed of, as such.

3. Faced with the aforementioned position, learned counsel for the petitioner states that he does not press the contempt petition, at this stage and the same may be disposed of, as such, while granting liberty to the petitioner to move an application for revival of the contempt petition, in the eventuality of vacation of stay in the LPA / decision in LPA in favour of the petitioner, whichever is earlier.

4. In view of the position noted above, as well as learned counsel for the petitioner, the contempt petition is ***disposed of***, as not pressed, at this stage, while granting liberty to the petitioner to move an application for revival of the contempt petition, in the eventuality of vacation of stay in the LPA / decision in the LPA in favour of the petitioner, whichever is earlier.
