The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.108 dated 15.06.2019, under Sections 186, 279, 307, 332, 337, 353, 427 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Rozka Meo, District Nuh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it is alleged in the FIR that the truck owned by the petitioner had met with an accident on the night intervening 12/13.06.2019. The FIR was registered after a delay of three days on 15.06.2019 although several police personnel were present at the spot. He further contends that the allegations against the petitioner are highly improbable inasmuch as it is alleged that the driver of the truck had told the police officials that he had received instructions from the petitioner/owner that whenever he saw any police personnel, he should run the truck over them. The petitioner is a lady. He also contends that the complainant, who is a police official, has received injuries on his leg and has fully recovered from the injury.

A Coordinate Bench of this Court, by order dated 08.07.2019 had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join investigation and in the event of her arrest, she was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Ashok Kumar, states that the petitioner has joined investigation.

In view of the above and the petitioner having joined investigation, the Covid-19 Pandemic, the order dated 08.07.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. She shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
