The petitioner pray for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.151 dated 16.05.2019, registered under Sections 420, 406, 506, 120-B of Indian Penal Code, 1860 at Police Station Civil Lines, Distt. Sirsa.

This is the second petition for grant of anticipatory bail and new ground for filing this petition is that some matter has been settled between the parties and the petitioner has relied on the affidavits of some of the victim .

Vide order dated 12.01.2021, the Investigating Officer was directed to verify the authenticity of the affidavits of Balkar Singh, Jagdish Raj and Surinderpal Singh.

Reply by way of affidavit of DSP (Headquarter), Sirsa is filed and as per the reply, on a complaint given against Gurdeep Singh alias Sonu, Amritpal Singh, Satpal Singh, Ajay Sood and Reet Singh, it is stated that the accused persons have allured the victims to pay money for procuring job for a

Company Vickson Farms Nova Sakotia, Canada and in that process, some

amount was given to the accused persons.

With regard to the affidavits, it is stated that the Investigating Officer has recorded the statements of the aforesaid three persons which is attached with the reply and in their respective statements, they have stated that they have given the affidavits (Annexures P-5 to P-7) acknowledging the some settlement.

Counsel for the complainants, however, submit that the entire payment has not been made.

Whatsoever considering the fact that some settlement has been arrived between the parties, the petitioner is granted the concession of anticipatory bail subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C. It will be open for the Investigating Officer to give him notice in writing to join the investigation as and when required.

The petition stands disposed of.
