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**ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)**

Heard through video conferencing.

The petitioners are seeking quashing of FIR No.43 dated 31.05.2020 under Sections 147, 149, 323, 506, 188 (326 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Sector 49, Chandigarh on the basis of compromise, which has been arrived at between the parties.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the FIR is an outcome of a minor altercation between the parties on account of parking of vehicle. Only simple injuries were caused in the incident. With the intervention of the respectables, the matter has been compromised.

A coordinate Bench of this Court, vide order dated 21.09.2021 had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court for recording their statements and send a report as to whether the compromise has been arrived at without any coercion or undue influence. The report of the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Chandigarh dated 23.11.2021 has been

received, wherein it is stated that in pursuance to the order of the coordinate Bench of this Court, the statements of the parties were recorded which indicates that compromise which has been effected is genuine, voluntary and without undue influence.

Learned counsel for the complainant states that the matter has indeed been compromised.

Heard.

The FIR is an outcome of a minor altercation between the parties on account of parking of vehicle and the matter has now been compromised.

In view of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in the case of **Narinder Singh vs. State of Punjab 2014 (6) SCC 466**, no useful purpose will be served by continuing the criminal proceedings. Therefore, the petition is allowed and FIR No.43 dated 31.05.2020 under Sections 147, 149, 323, 506, 188 (326 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Sector 49, Chandigarh and all consequential proceedings are hereby quashed qua the petitioners.
