GIRISH AGNIHOTRI, J. (Oral)

Petitioner-Stya Dev, stated to be aged 40 years, has filed the present petition *inter alia* with a prayer for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to extend the last date for submission of online applications qua the advertisement dated 09.06.2019 (Annexure P-2).

Records of the case show that on 16.07.2019, the following order was passed:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that though the petitioner has submitted application form online for the post of Sub Inspector in pursuance to advertisement No.6 of 2019 (Annexure P-2) dated 09.06.2019 but fee was not accepted by the system. The respondent-HSSC extended the last date for submission of application to 11.07.2019. The Government has come out with the instructions dated 03.07.2019 (Annexure P-1) in terms of judgment passed by this Court in CWP No.17206 of 2014 titled as “Yogesh

Tyagi and another vs. State of Haryana and others”, wherein, directions have been issued to the effect that all employees, who have worked on ad-hoc/contractual/work charged/daily wages, shall be granted further age relaxation to the extent of period they have worked continuously.

Ms. Shruti Jain Goyal, learned Deputy Advocate General, Haryana, submits that age cannot be relaxed for the post of Sub Inspector and prays for time to seek instructions.

Adjourned to 17.07.2019.”

In response thereto, a short reply dated 10.12.2019, on behalf of respondent No.2, has been filed.

Learned counsel for the State submits that for the post of Sub Inspector Police (Male), a fresh advertisement has been issued on 15.06.2021. He submits that in this view of the matter, the present writ petition has become infructuous.

In view of the above, with the consent of counsel for the parties, the present writ petition is taken up on board today itself i.e. 31.08.2021.

This Court finds that since a fresh advertisement has been issued on 15.06.2021, the petitioner is at liberty to apply in pursuance thereto or seek any further directions, if so aggrieved by filing a fresh writ petition.

Accordingly, the present writ petition is disposed of as having become infructuous. Subsequent application(s) pending with the writ petition, also stand disposed of.
