This is petitioner's third attempt to get bail pending trial in a criminal case arising from FIR No.68 dated 30.10.2019 registered under Section 21, 22, 25, 29, 61 and 85 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, at Police Station Thuliwal, District Barnala.

As per the case of the prosecution, on the receipt of a secret information that four persons namely Sukhwinder Singh, Jinder Singh s/o Harmesh Singh, Lakhwinder Singh Toti son of Gurdial Singh and the petitioner are bringing a consignment of intoxicating tablets and vials of the intoxicating liquid, from the other States, in their car bearing registration no.PB-11-CC-0285. On a check point, the car was stopped. Sukhwinder Singh and Lakhwinder Singh were apprehended with 1,65,000/- intoxicating tablets of Clovidol SR. During investigation, the petitioner's name was figured and he was apprehended. On the disclosure statement of the petitioner, 1,44,000 intoxicating tablets were recovered from the other two co-accused.

Learned counsel representing the petitioner contends that in

fact there is no recovery from the petitioner.

On the directions of the Court, the Senior Superintendent of Police, Barnala, filed a status report. It has been submitted that the name of the petitioner figured in the secret information as well as in the FIR. It has further been stated that the petitioner used to procure intoxicating tablets and vials from the other States like Delhi and Uttar Pradesh and used to distribute them in the different areas of Punjab. It has further been pointed out that as per the police investigation, the petitioner has exchanged 79 calls with accused Sukhwinder Singh and 114 calls with accused Jinder Singh.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, no ground to grant the concession of bail to the petitioner is made out.

Hence, dismissed.
