The petitioner has invoked the jurisdiction of this Court in terms of Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking prayer by way of writ of *mandamus* for issuance of directions to the respondents to count petitioner's previous service rendered in Punjab State Leather Development Corporation Limited towards her revised pension and other pensionary benefits as well as grant her pay protection w.e.f. her entitlement along with interest @ 18% per annum, especially, in terms of rules governing her conditions of Service, especially in view of the instructions issued by the State of Punjab on 02.05.2002 (Annexure P-1) and 18.04.2016 (Annexure P-

16) as well as Punjab Civil Services Rules Vol-II, Part-II including law laid down in LPA No.44 of 2006, State of Punjab and others versus Subhash Chander Chadha and another decided on 24.03.2009 (Annexure P-3) wherein SLP filed by State was dismissed and CWP No.16538 of 2011, Ajit Singh Bhatoya Versus State of Punjab and others decided on 06.09.2011 (Annexure P-10).

Upon hearing learned counsel of both the sides and on perusal of the records, the present petition stands disposed off with the directions to the official respondents to consider the representations dated 05.12.2018 and 16.07.2019 (Annexures P-22 and P-24, respectively) and legal notice dated 24.06.2021 (Annexure P-27) as representation moved by the petitioner and decide the same in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order preferably within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order.

If found entitled and if there is no impediment for the release of payment, the same be granted to the petitioner without any delay, as per law.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
