GIRISH AGNIHOTRI, J. (Oral)

The matter has been taken up through video-conferencing on account of restrictions due to outbreak of pandemic COVID-19.

This application has been filed by the appellant-Madhurima Arora, *inter alia* with the prayer for transfer of petition filed by respondent (husband) against the petitioner, under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act as amended by Marriage Laws (Amendment) Act, 1976.

Records of the case show that on 02.11.2020, this Court had passed the following order:-

“The matter has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing due to outbreak of COVID-19.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the mother of the petitioner has been detected with mouth cancer and for this reason, the petitioner, who was working in Chandigarh has to leave his job so as to take care of her mother.

He further submits that the petition under Section 125 Cr.P.C. and the complaint under Sections 12, 18, 19(1)(F), 19(8), 20 (1)(d) and 22 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 filed by the petitioner are pending at Patiala, where the petitioner is staying with her mother. The respondent has filed the divorce petition under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 before the Family Court, Ludhiana. Due to the family circumstances and to take care of

her ailing mother, it is very difficult for the petitioner to attend the proceedings at Ludhiana.

Notice of motion for 21.12.2020.

Meanwhile, the family Court, Ludhiana shall adjourn the case beyond the date fixed in this petition.

Since the parties are doctors by profession, they shall remain present before this Court on the next date of hearing through video conferencing”

Today on resumed hearing of the case, learned counsel for the parties submitted that the matter has been compromised between the parties. It is prayed that no further orders are called for in the present case.

Accordingly, the present Transfer Application stands disposed of as having become infructuous.
