Case taken up through video conferencing.

The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.264 dated 29.09.2018, under Section 22 (c) of the NDPS Act, 1985, registered at Police Station Sadar, Dabwali, District Sirsa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that 2150 tablets containing tramadol were allegedly recovered from the petitioner. The petitioner is in custody for over 01 year and 04 months. He is not involved in any other case under the NDPS Act.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI Naresh Kumar states that although the challan has been filed but no prosecution witness has been examined.

Heard through video conferencing.

In view of the above, especially when the petitioner is in custody for over 01 year and 04 months, he is not involved in any other cases under the

NDPS Act, Covid 19 pandemic and the conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
