This order shall dispose of the above numbered seven writ petitions. All these writ petitions were filed claiming benefits under the newly enacted agriculture laws brought in force by the Union of India. However, now the Hon'ble Supreme Court; vide order dated 12.1.2021, has ordered the said laws enacted by the Parliament to be kept in abeyance, pending consideration before the Supreme Court. Hence, as of today, there is no law in force under which this Court can proceed further in this matter. Hence, all these writ petitions are dismissed as infructuous.

However, the petitioners would be at liberty to file fresh petitions qua the same cause of action, in case the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in above said case comes in favour of the laws enacted by the Parliament; or qua any other relief not connected with such laws.
