The present petition under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 has been filed by the petitioner-wife seeking transfer of the petition filed by the respondent-husband under Sections 7, 17 and 25 of the Guardian and Wards Act, 1890 read with Section 6 and 13 of the Hindu Minority and Guardianship Act, 1956 titled as "*Sandeep Goyal Vs. Shilpa Goyal*" pending in the Court of Principal Judge, Family Court, Dabwali, District Sirsa to the Court of competent jurisdiction at Sirsa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner would contend that presently the petitioner is residing with her parents at Sirsa and that she has to travel a distance of about 65 kms in order to attend the proceedings before the Family Court, Dabwali, District Sirsa and it would be difficult for her to contest the case there properly.

Learned counsel for the respondent states on instructions from the respondent that he has no objection if the present case is allowed and the petition filed under Section Sections 7, 17 and 25 of the Guardian and Wards

Act, 1890 read with Section 6 and 13 of the Hindu Minority and Guardianship Act, 1956 is transferred.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the above and keeping in view the fact that the petitioner-wife in the present case is residing at Sirsa and would have to travel 65 kms one way in order to attend the proceedings before the Family Court at Dabwali as also the fact that the respondent has no objection to the transfer of the case, I deem it appropriate to allow the present petition and to transfer the petition filed by the respondent-husband under Sections 7, 17 and 25 of the Guardian and Wards Act, 1890 read with Section 6 and 13 of the Hindu Minority and Guardianship Act, 1956 titled as "*Sandeep Goyal Vs. Shilpa Goyal*" pending in the Court of Principal Judge, Family Court, Dabwali, District Sirsa to the Court of competent jurisdiction at Sirsa.

The records of the case shall be sent by the concerned Court to the Court of the learned District Judge, Sirsa and the parties shall appear there on **25.11.2021** at 10.00 a.m.

The present petition is disposed off in the above terms.
