The petitioners are seeking quashing of FIR No.94 dated 05.10.2020, under Sections 323, 326, 148, 149 IPC registered at Police Station Kabirpur (Ahli Kalan), district Kapurthala on the basis of compromise dated 27.10.2020 (Annexure P-2) which has been arrived at between the parties.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the FIR is the outcome of a sudden quarrel between the relatives in which simple injuries were caused except one which was on the non-vital part of the body for which offence under Section 326 IPC was invoked. He also contends that the matter has been compromised and has referred to a copy of the compromise at Annexure P-2.

Learned counsel for respondents No.2 & 3 states that the matter has indeed been compromised.

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A Coordinate Bench of this Court vide order dated 10.11.2020 had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court for recording their statements and send a report as to whether the compromise has been arrived at without any coercion or undue influence. The report of the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Sultanpur Lodhi dated 22.12.2020 has been received, wherein it is stated that in pursuance to the order of this Court, the statements of the parties were recorded which indicates that compromise which has been effected is genuine, voluntary and without undue influence.

The FIR is the outcome of a sudden quarrel between the relatives and the matter has now been compromised. In view of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in the case of **Narinder Singh vs. State of Punjab 2014 (6) SCC 466**, no useful purpose will be served by continuing the criminal proceedings. Therefore, the petition is allowed and FIR No.94 dated 05.10.2020, under Sections 323, 326, 148, 149 IPC registered at Police Station Kabirpur (Ahli Kalan), district Kapurthala and all consequential proceedings are hereby quashed qua the petitioner(s).
