This petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of a writ of certiorari for quashing the letter dated 3.8.2021 (Annexure P-4), issued by respondent No. 2 to respondent No.3, informing the latter that the proposal to give appointment to the petitioner in Class III (from Class IV), on compassionate grounds, has been considered and rejected by the senior officers. Further prayer of the petitioner is for issuance of a writ of mandamus directing the respondents to give appointment to the petitioner in Class III (from Class IV) on compassionate grounds for the reason that he had received serious bullet injuries damaging his body and career.

The petition is lacking in and the counsel has failed to refer to even the basic facts as to in which proceedings; the petitioner is a witness of the prosecution; as claimed by the petitioner. Otherwise also, no legal basis has been laid in the petition, as such, for sustaining the claim made in the petition. Nothing has been shown to the Court that the petitioner could make

the report of a Commission of enquiry as a basis for claiming compassionate appointment to a public service. Hence, the present petition is totally frivolous, which deserves to be dismissed with cost.

Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed with Rs.15,000/-as cost. The cost is ordered to be deposited with the Institute for the Blinds, Sector 26, Chandigarh and copy of the receipt be placed on record within two weeks.
