JAISHREE THAKUR, J.

This is a petition that has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for passing any appropriate order to meet the ends of justice with a specific prayer for setting aside the order dated 29.11.2019 by which the revision filed by the respondents herein against the summoning order stands allowed.

In brief, the facts are that the petitioner herein filed a complaint under Sections 324, 323, 341, 342, 120-B, 498-A, 506, 148, 149 IPC against seven accused before the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Ferozepur. The Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Ferozepur, by order dated 25.7.2019 came to the conclusion that no ground is made out to summon accused No. 1, 2, 6 and 7, as it could not be presumed that any alleged maltreatment was meted out to the complainant, petitioner herein, at the hands of the said accused persons, who are brothers-in-law of the complainant and their wives. However, only accused No. 3, 4 and 5 (i.e. Husband, father-in-law

and mother-in-law of the complainant) were ordered to be summoned. Aggrieved against the said order, both the complainant as well as the accused No. 4 and 5 preferred revisions before the Additional Sessions Judge, Ferozepur, who by the impugned order dismissed the revision filed by the complainant and allowed the revision filed by accused No. 4 and 5, respondents herein, thereby setting aside the summoning order qua them.

The sole prayer made in the instant petition is that the petitioner wants to bury the hatchet keeping in view the well being of three years old child. It is prayed that the parties be called and the matter be referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court so that the grievances of both the sides could be addressed.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and find no ground to interfere with the impugned order and allow the petition on the ground that the parties be referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court. The proceedings qua the husband is already pending before the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Ferozepur, in a complaint filed by the petitioner and in case she is keen to have to the dispute settled amicably with her husband she is always at liberty to make the same prayer before the said Court, which in turn would take a decision on the said prayer.

In view of the above, the instant petition stands dismissed.
