1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

2. Additional Affidavit filed by learned counsel for respondent No.2 is taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.

3. Learned counsel for respondent No.2 states that in terms of order dated 01.12.2016 in CWP No.17824 of 1998, entire financial benefits payable to be petitioner, including interest @ 9% per annum with effect from the date he approached the Court, till date of payment, have been released to him by making payment of Rs.12,10,347/- on account of pensionary benefits plus leave encashment and gratuity, while a sum of Rs.10,42,121/- has been paid to the petitioner on 04.02.2021 by way of interest through RTGS, therefore no further orders are called for

and the Contempt Petition may be disposed of as such.

4. In view of the position noted above, learned counsel for the petitioner states that he does not press the contempt petition and the same may be disposed of, as such, while granting liberty to the petitioner to move an application for revival of the contempt petition, if on reconciliation it is found that amount has not been paid to the petitioner as per his entitlement.

5. In view of the position stated above, the contempt petition is ***disposed of*** as not pressed with the liberty, as prayed for.
