The petitioner has invoked the jurisdiction of this Court in terms of Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking prayer by way of writ of *mandamus* for issuance of directions to the respondents to grant revised pension and other retiral benefits to the petitioner after counting the service rendered by the petitioner on daily wages w.e.f. 28.08.1987 to 30.06.2003 (Annexure P-10) i.e. Before his joining on regular basis under the respondent department as per the settled law, judgment and statutory provisions.
