The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.123 dated 14.06.2021, under Sections 408, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it is alleged that the petitioner along with other co-accused had misappropriated Rs.7,25,000/- from the petrol pump owned by the complainant. He further contends that the petitioner has misappropriated money in June 2020 but FIR was registered on 14.06.2021. He also contends that there was dispute with regard to the wages of the petitioner with the complainant. The petitioner does not have any criminal antecedents.

This Court, by the order dated 14.10.2021, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Bhupinder Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation.

In view of the above, especially when the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 14.10.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
