1. This order shall dispose off the aforesaid two petitions i.e. CRM-M-39843-2020 filed on behalf of Baljit Singh @ Jaggi as well as CRM-M-357-2021 filed on behalf of Vikramjit Singh & others seeking quashing of FIR No.301 dated 20.08.2020 registered at Police Station Karnal Civil Lines, District Karnal, under Sections 406/420/506 IPC and Section 24 of the Immigration Act as well as

all subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of a compromise having been effected between the parties.

2. Vide orders dated 01.12.2020 in CRM-M-39843-2020 and 07.01.2021 in CRM-M-357-2021, the parties had also been directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court so as to get their statements recorded qua the factum of compromise.
3. Separate reports of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Karnal have been received, wherein it has been reported that the statements of accused/petitioners Baljit Singh @ Jaggi Maan in CRM-M-39843-2020 and Vikramjit Singh, Amrit Pal Singh, Komal Preet Kaur and Amrik Singh in CRM-M-357-2021 and also of complainant Hardeep Singh and his son Sahejdeep (arrayed as respondent No.3 in CRM-M-357-2021) have been recorded to the effect that they have compromised the matter amongst themselves.
4. The complainant Hardeep Singh and his son Sahejdeep in their statements have stated that they have no objection in case the FIR in question is quashed.
5. The learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Karnal has specifically opined that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily without there being any pressure, coercion and undue influence.
6. In view of the aforesaid compromise and bearing in mind the law laid down by Full Bench of this Court in 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052 Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.301 dated 20.08.2020 registered at Police Station Karnal Civil Lines, District Karnal, under Sections 406/420/506 IPC and Section 24 of the Immigration Act as well as

all subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom are hereby
quashed qua petitioners.
