ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 458 dated 10.07.2021, under Sections 406, 420, 467, 468 and 471 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station City Hansi.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it is alleged that the petitioner had introduced the complainant to co-accused Aman, who had allegedly sold the stolen tractor to him. He, however, contends that the FIR was lodged due to misunderstanding and the matter has been compromised with the intervention of the respectables. He has referred to the copy of the compromise at Annexure P2.

Issue notice to the respondent.

At the asking of the Court, Mr. Anant Kataria, DAG, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of respondent No. 1-State. He contends that in view of the gravity of the offence alleged to have been committed by the

petitioner, he is not entitled to the concession of anticipatory bail.

Ms. Aarti Sharma, Advocate, has put in appearance on behalf of respondent No. 2 (complainant) and filed 'power of attorney', which is taken on record. She contends that the matter has indeed been compromised.

Heard.

The petitioner has been arraigned as an accused on the allegations that he had introduced the complainant to co-accused Aman, who had allegedly sold the stolen tractor to him and the matter has now been compromised. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case and in view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, the petitioner is directed to appear before the investigating officer within a period of 15 days from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and on his doing so, he shall be released on bail to the satisfaction of the arresting/investigating officer till submission of report under Section 173 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 ('Cr.P.C.' - for short). The petitioner shall continue to join investigation and shall furnish an undertaking that he shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C. Thereafter, he will be permitted to furnish regular bail bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

The petition stands disposed of in the aforementioned terms.
