The case has been taken up for hearing through
video-conferencing.

This petition has been filed under Section 438
Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No. 186
dated 12.09.2020 under Sections 354, 506 IPC registered at
Police Station Sangat District Bathinda.

On 03.12.2020, while issuing notice of motion,
following order was passed:-

*“The case has been taken up for hearing
through video-conferencing.*

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the alleged hurling of abuses would show that the petitioner had some previous issue with the complainant party. After registration of the FIR, the complainant has already executed an affidavit in pursuance of the compromise effected before the panchayat.

Notice of motion for 29.01.2021.

In the meanwhile, petitioner is directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to join investigation on 07.12.2020 at 11.00 a.m. and in the event of his arrest, he shall be enlarged on ad interim bail, subject to his furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Today learned counsel for the complainant admits the factum of compromise between the parties.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Arjan Singh, states that the petitioner has joined the investigation to the entire satisfaction of the Investigating Officer and he is not

required in any further investigation of the case.

In view of above interim order dated 03.12.2020 is made absolute. However, the petitioner shall keep on joining the investigation as and when required to do so and he shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
