This is a petition for regular bail under Section 439 Cr.P.C. on behalf of the petitioner, in case FIR No.590 dated 17.07.2020, under Sections 307, 309 and 328 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Model Town Panipat, District Panipat.

[2]. By now the petitioner has remained in detention for 01 year and 01 month following his arrest on 06.11.2020. It may be mentioned that the complainant in the present case was none other than the petitioner himself, who admitted before the police that he had administered poisonous substances not only to himself but also to his minor children on account of his frustration for having been tortured at the hands of his wife who was allegedly having some illicit relationship.

[3] After completion of investigation, challan against the petitioner was submitted. So far only 06 out of the total 12 witnesses cited from the prosecution side have been examined.

[4] Learned State counsel fairly concedes that none of the prosecution witnesses examined so far have supported the prosecution case.

[5] As such, further detention of the petitioner for an indefinite period is not justified.

[6]. For the aforesaid reasons, without commenting any further on the merits of the present case as a whole, but in view of the detention undergone by the petitioner, the prayer of the petitioner for regular bail is allowed and he is ordered to be released on bail subject to appropriate terms and conditions to the satisfaction of the Ld. Trial Court/Duty Magistrate, concerned.
