This common order shall dispose of above noted three petitions
as they are identical in nature and have been filed by the same

accused/petitioner.

Prayer in these petitions is for grant of anticipatory bail to petitioner Onkar Singh in three FIRs i.e. FIR Nos. 0034, 0057 and 0025, dated 19.05.2021, 07.07.2021 and 15.04.2021, respectively, registered under Section 61 of the Punjab Excise Act, 1914 at Police Station Bhindi Saidan, District Amritsar Rural.

Reply, by way of the affidavit of the DSP, Sub Division Attari, Amritsar Rural, has been filed in Court today and the same is taken on record.

A perusal of the record shows that in FIR No. 0034, the police, on the basis of a secret information, has recovered 150 Kgs. of Lahan from the house of the petitioner, however, the petitioner managed to run away from the spot.

Similarly, in FIR No. 0057, the police, on receiving a secret information that petitioner is distilling illicit liquor in a room in his fields, registered the present FIR and thereafter, recovery of two drums containing 150 Kgs. of 200 Kgs. of Lahan, respectively and 30 bottles of illicit liquor, each containing 750 ml, was effected. In FIR No. 0025 again, 180 Kgs. of Lahan was recovered from the cattle shed of the house of the petitioner, however, the petitioner could not be arrested as he escaped from the spot.

A perusal of the aforesaid affidavit, filed today in Court, shows that the petitioner as well as his brother are involved in as many as 08 FIRs under the Excise Act and the petitioner already stands in two other FIRs under the Excise Act.

In view of the same, no ground is made out to grant the

concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, all the three petitions are dismissed.
