The matter has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing due to outbreak of COVID-19.

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.182 dated 16.04.2018 registered under Sections 384 and 506 of IPC (Section 34 IPC and Section 25/54/59 of Arms Act added lateron) at Police Station City Narnaul, District Mahendergarh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to the order dated 22.12.2020 passed by this Court, petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Jaipal, states that the phone, statedly used in the crime, has been recovered in the

case and has been sent for forensic analysis. However, he states that pursuant to the order dated 22.12.2020, petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is no more required at this stage.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Since the petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is no more required, present petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 22.12.2020 is made absolute.

However, if required, the petitioner shall continue to join investigation as and when required to do so and shall abide by the terms and conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

It is made clear that the petitioner shall not extend any threat and shall not influence any prosecution witnesses in any manner directly or indirectly.
