The instant Petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking Regular Bail on behalf of the petitioner in case FIR No.99, dated 15.10.2018, registered under Sections 302, 307, 323, 201, 148, 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Sections 25, 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 at Police Station Bhadaur, District Barnala.

2. Reply by way of short affidavit of the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Tapa along with photocopies of the Medical Reports pertaining to the petitioner's-wife (R-1 collectively) have been sent up on behalf of the State in compliance of the previous order.

3. Perusal of the Examination Report/OPD slip issued by the Government Rajindra Hospital, Patiala dated 4th January, 2021(Annexure R-2) clearly goes to show that according to the concerned Senior Resident, the patient (petitioner's-wife) does not need any emergency surgery.

4. Before proceeding to pass the final order, it is relevant to add that vide order dated 23.12.2020, Ld. Counsel for the petitioner had confined his prayer to grant of interim bail only to the petitioner.

5. In view of the status report, this Court finds no ground to release the petitioner on bail at this stage.
