The petitioners have invoked the jurisdiction of this Court in terms of Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking prayer by way of writ of *mandamus* for issuance of directions to the respondents to release the pensionary benefits i.e. Ex-Gratia, IVR Medical for further treatment, pension (gratuity) since death, of late Shri Mahinder Singh (Linneman) to his legal heirs with further prayer to release his pension in equal share in favour of Harpreet Kaur (daughter) and Harjinder Pal Singh (minor son), with further prayer to provide the Job to petitioner No.1 (married daughter) at the place of his father on compassionate grounds, as he had expired during his service tenure on 07.02.2019 (Annexure P-2) inter alia on the grounds set forth in the present petition in the interest of justice, equity and fair play.

Heard.

Upon hearing learned counsel for the petitioners and on perusal of the records, the present petition stands disposed off with the directions to the respondents to consider the representation dated 04.10.2021 (Annexure P-8) moved by the petitioners and decide the same in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order preferably within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order.

If found entitled and if there is no impediment for the release of payment, the same be granted to the petitioners without any delay, as per law.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
