GIRISH AGNIHOTRI, J. (Oral)

Petitioner-Darshan Singh, stated to be aged 38 years, has filed the present writ petition *inter alia* with a prayer for quashing the inaction of respondent Nos.1 and 2 in not selecting and appointing the petitioner on the post of AYUSH Pharmacist (Ayurvedic) advertised vide Advst. dt.01.03.2019 (Annexure P-8) whereby applications for 10 posts in pursuance of the requisition sent by Directorate of Ayurveda, Punjab dated 07.02.2019 (Annexure P-6) and letter dated 25.02.2019(Annexure P-7) have been invited, despite the fact that the petitioner was placed at No.3 in General Category merit list, along with further prayer for quashing the action of respondent Nos.1 to 3 in selecting and appointing Respondent No.4 on the post of Ayush Pharmacist who has not passed Punjabi of Matric

standard on the last date of advertisement which is pre requisite qualification for appointment as per Rule 17 of Punjab Civil Services (General and Common conditions of Service) Rules, 1994 (Annexure P-5).

Records of the case show that on 21.12.2020, notice of motion was issued.

Today on resumed hearing of the case, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that during the pendency of the present writ petition, the petitioner has been allowed to join as Ayush Pharmacist (Ayurvedic). She, therefore, prays that the present writ petition has become infructuous as no further orders are called for.

In view of the above, present writ petition stands disposed of as having become infructuous.
