The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case bearing FIR No.146 dated 15.08.2019 registered under Sections 420 and 120B IPC at Police Station Kotwali Bathinda, Distt. Bathinda.

On 06.09.2019, following order was passed:-

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in the FIR, only allegation against the petitioner is that he introduced M/s Periwinkle Herbals Pvt. Ltd. with complainant for business purposes and later on complainant entered into agreement and some fraud is alleged to have

been committed by M/s Periwinkle Herbals Pvt. Ltd. with the complainant. The petitioner was earlier in contact with the complainant as a salesman of M/s Miracle Writing Instrument Company and had simply given introduction of M/s Periwinkle Herbals Pvt. Ltd. to the complainant, who became authorised dealer of their cosmetics products at Bathinda and except this petitioner has no role in the transaction.

Notice of motion for 10.12.2019.

Mr. Binderjit Singh, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of complainant, filed power of attorney and submits that in fact, petitioner is the main person, who had prompted the complainant to deal with M/s Periwinkle Herbals Pvt. Ltd. despite fully knowing that it is a fake company.

Petitioner is directed to surrender before the police and join investigation within two weeks. In the event of his arrest being required, he shall be released on interim bail till the next date, subject to his furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, he shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2)(i) to (iv) Cr.P.C. failing which he shall lose the benefit of interim bail allowed to him.
