1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic.

2. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that the respondent has deposited the amount of Rs.20,000/- per month up to date, therefore, the petitioner does not wish to press the contempt petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same at this stage while directing the respondent to ensure timely deposit of sum of Rs.20,000/- every month in the account of the petitioner.

3. Learned counsel for the respondent on instructions from the respondent states that payment of Rs.20,000/- would be deposited in the account of the petitioner by the 5th of each month.

4. The same satisfies learned counsel for the petitioner, who states that in the circumstances, he does not press the contempt petition and the same may be permitted to be withdrawn with liberty to the

petitioner to move an application for revival of the contempt petition, if the circumstances of the case, so warrant.

5. In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the parties, the contempt petition is ***dismissed as withdraw*** with the liberty, as prayed for.
