The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case bearing FIR No.146 dated 15.08.2019 registered under Sections 420 and 120B IPC at Police Station Kotwali Bathinda, Distt. Bathinda.

On 09.09.2019, following order was passed:-

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is CEO of M/s Periwinkle Herbals Pvt. Limited and complainant had deal

for supply of cosmetics products. No payment was made to the petitioner and he is not signatory to any agreement with the complainant. Co-accused Yadwinder Dutt has already been allowed interim bail vide order dated 06.09.2019 passed in CRM-M-37574-2019.

Notice of motion for 10.12.2019. List with CRM-M-37574-2019.

Mr. Binderjit Singh, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of complainant and filed power of attorney. Petitioner is directed to surrender before the police and join investigation within two weeks. In the event of his arrest being required, he shall be released on interim bail till the next date, subject to his furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, he shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2)(i) to (iv) Cr.P.C. failing which he shall lose the benefit of interim bail allowed to him.
