The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.0167 dated 18.08.2016 registered under Sections 420, 406, 34 IPC at Police Station Tanda, District Hoshiarpur.

On 31.12.2020, following order was passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in the present case the FIR is the result of matrimonial dispute between the petitioner and his wife. He has further submitted that so far as istridhan of the petitioner is concerned, the petitioner has returned all the articles except for LED, Cooler, Washing Machine and almirah

which are in his possession and petitioner wishes to return the same back to the wife at the time of joining investigation. He has further submitted that so far as motorcycle is concerned, the same was also returned to the brother of the complainant a long time ago. He has further submitted that so far as jewellery items are concerned, he has returned the entire jewellery which was part of istridhan.

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr.Harpreet Singh Multani, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of State and prays for time to seek instructions. List on 23.2.2021.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds/surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
