The petitioner has filed this petition under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India, praying for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to re-compute the pension of the petitioner and pay the same along with arrears and interest @ 18 % and also the gratuity of the petitioner along with interest @ 18% from the date of retirement for the delayed payment.

At the outset, the counsel for the petitioner submits that at this stage the petitioner would be satisfied if respondents are directed to decide representation dated 15.02.2021 (Annexure P-10), within some time bound frame.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Harish Rathee, Deputy Advocate General, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the respondents-State and has submitted that the State is not averse to expeditious disposal of grievance of the petitioner.

In view of the above, respondents-State is directed to take a conscious decision upon representation dated 15.02.2021 (Annexure P-10), within a period of three months from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order.

It is further ordered that in case the petitioner is found entitled to the financial benefits on such conscious decision to be taken by the respondents-State, then the same shall be actually released to the petitioner within a further period of three months from the date of such decision.

The petition stands disposed of with above said direction.
