After arguing for a while, when learned counsel for the petitioners realises that this Court is not inclined to grant the relief as prayed for by the petitioners, he seeks permission to withdraw the instant petition while praying that the appeal, as pending before the appellate Court, is scheduled to be listed tomorrow, i.e on 16.12.2021, for hearing the arguments but learned counsel appearing for the present petitioners, i.e the appellants therein, needs some more time to prepare for addressing the arguments and therefore, the trial Court be directed to grant 5/7 days' time for this purpose.

Ms. Dhivya Jerath, Advocate, who has appeared on behalf of respondent No.2-complainant in this case and has submitted her power of attorney in the Court (which has been placed on the file) as well as

Mr. Amitoj Singh Dhaliwal, learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, who has also put in appearance on behalf of respondent No.1-State in this case in pursuance of the copy of the instant petition having been sent to this respondent in advance, have no objection to the above-discussed submission as well as the prayer as made by learned counsel for the petitioners.

Resultantly, the petition in hand stands dismissed for having been withdrawn, with a direction to the Court below/appellate Court to adjourn the appeal pending before it, to some date well before 23.12.2021 as per its convenience.
