The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.134 dated 11.07.2019, under Sections 452, 427, 506 and 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Chattiwind, District Amritsar (Rural).

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the accused had entered into the house and damaged the window panes but no injury was caused to anybody. He further contends the petitioners have been arraigned as accused on the basis of disclosure statement of the co-accused Yuvraj Singh. He also contends that there is a delay of 6 days in registering the FIR.

A coordinate Bench of this Court, by the order dated 14.11.2019, had directed the petitioners to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of their arrest, they were ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from SI Shamsher Singh, states that the petitioners have joined investigation.

In view of the above, especially when the petitioners having joined investigation, the order dated 14.11.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
